

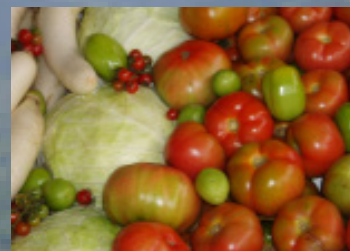

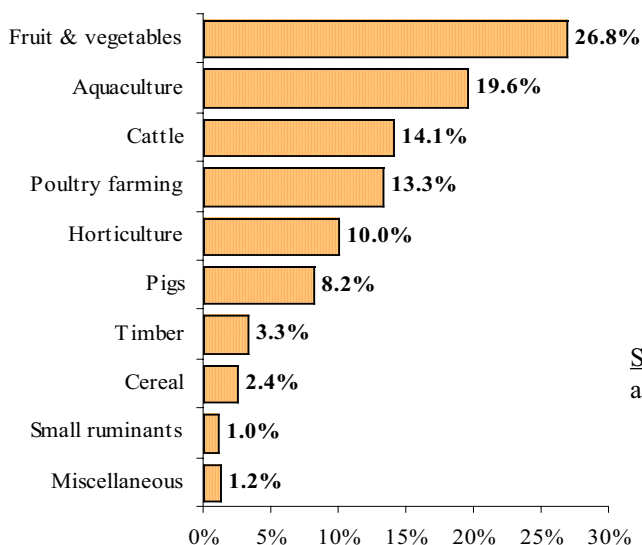

## Percentage breakdown by agricultural sector

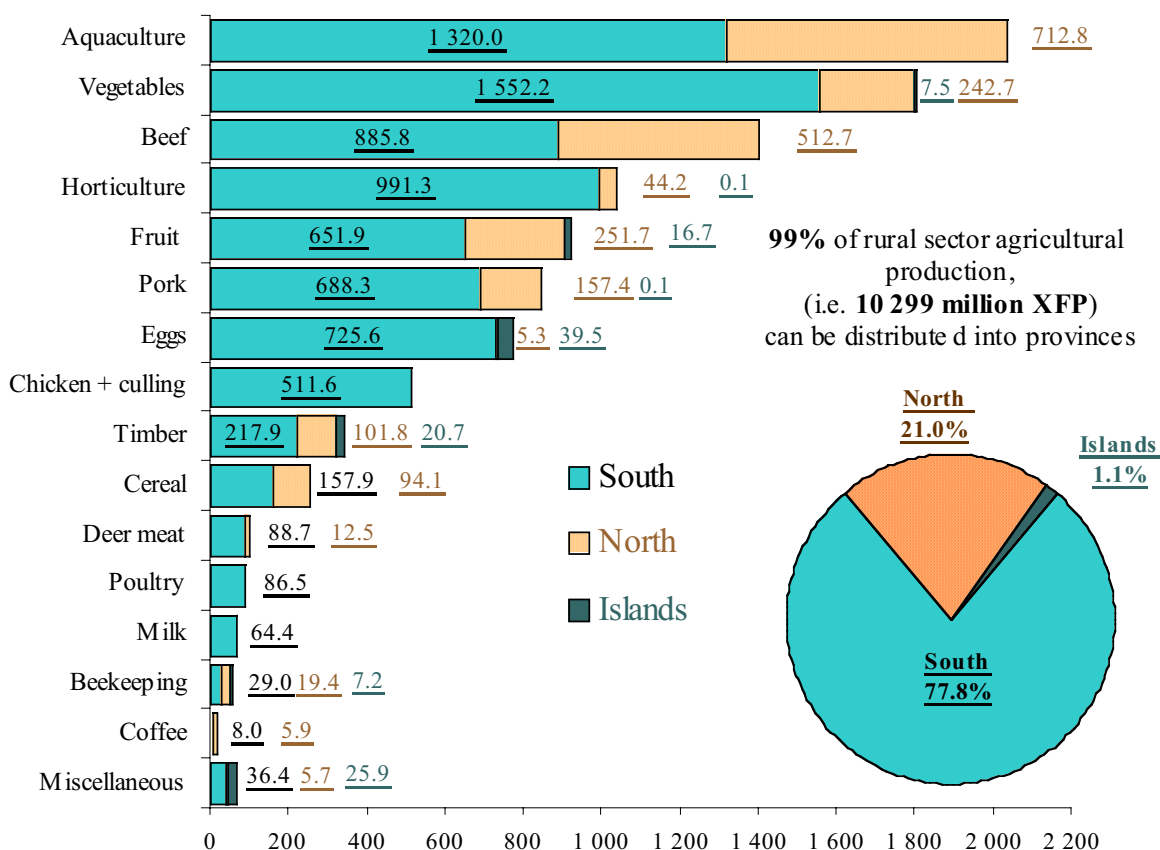

(provisional figures, million XPF)



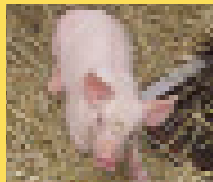

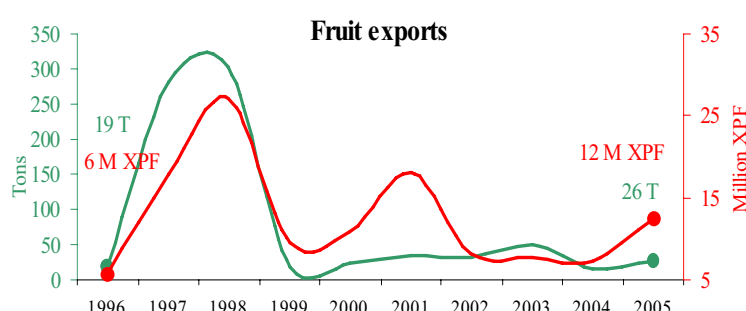
